

## Attention! Soccer South Bay Referee Association (SSBRA) Officials March 28, 2017

Officials,

Please note that the City of Lawndale Community Services Department requires each SSBRA soccer official working games in the 2017 City of Lawndale Spring Youth Soccer Program to submit to the City two documents as follows prior to working his/her first game of the season, or as soon thereafter as possible:

## Release, Hold Harmless and Agreement Not to Sue Waiver:

Please complete this waiver at the administrative table prior to working your first game, or as soon as possible thereafter, in the Lawndale Spring Youth Soccer Program for 2017. Only one waiver must be completed by each official for the entire 2017 season.

**Submission**: Each official shall leave the waiver with staff at the administrative table once completed. So we are certain that the right person is signing the document, please complete the process in the presence of staff at the administrative table.

## **Personal Auto Liability Insurance Documentation:**

Valid personal auto liability insurance meeting minimum California State requirements per California Insurance Code Section11580.1b identifying the official as a driver on the policy is required.
